#### PROGRAM SUMMARY

## Small Projects (July 2009 - June 2010)

14 small projects have been completed focused on various subjects including hand-written newspapers, exploring local history, lab study of local "living fossil" jellyfish, study of the local agricultural plants, etc.

## Healthcare Education, Tongwei 通渭, GanSu (July 2009 - July 2012)

The project is to promote healthcare awareness and deliver healthcare knowledge to the school students and the local community through public and school library system.

It includes equipping a clinic for Tongwei No. 1 High School, sponsoring annual physical examination for students, compiling healthcare brochures, matching curriculum or seminars, and an oral health education subproject supported by Colgate.

## Rural IT Training, Tianzhu 天祝, GanSu (July 2009 - July 2012)

Collaborating with 6 elementary/middle schools in the nearby 4 agricultural areas, and utilizing hardware equipments donated by Evergreen, Tianzhu No. 1 High School trains the local farmers on information technology and how to acquire information for livelihood and life from the Internet. Besides local school staff. villager volunteers, student volunteers from Lanzhou Univ., volunteers from Shanxi library academia, all contribute to the training's effectiveness..
